MAJA MEHMEDOVIC'S **Recipe for Success**

What is necessary in order to accomplish our goals and be successful? Some would say talent, some tenacity, while others would say love. For Maja Mehmedovic, hard work takes the number one spot, and it is closely followed by support. In addition to these two, to the mix is also added perseverance, self-discipline, as well as other ingredients which possibly include chance.

On Saturday, 10th of June, the scholarship holders of the Hastor Foundation who were present at the monthly meeting had an opportunity to listen to the life story of Maja Mehmedovic, the CEO and the board member of ProCredit Bank. What was particularly interesting to the college student scholarship holders was the fact that Mrs. Mehmedovic is one of "Foundation's children".

Maja's life journey began in Sarajevo. Her childhood innocence ended with the outbreak of war in our region, and because of it she left Sarajevo with her parents and sought refuge in Split, and later in Germany where she finished her secondary school and university level education. Adjusting to the new surroundings and overcoming the language barrier

posed a highly challenging obstacle which Maja, nevertheless, managed to overcome with considerable effort she put in every day and for hours on end. She also points out that, while on this path, she received the support of not only her parents, but also of the school principal, the professors, and a certain German foundation later on. Hard work and support are two significant aspects that had ensured that Maja finished the secondary school in Germany as the third best student in the whole school, that she finished two different colleges and that she found a job. Through all of this, she as an individual grew and reached self-actualization. She also emphasizes that besides hard work and support, criticism is also important for one's development, but only if it is well-meaning.



Every successful person has their own recipe for success. At the monthly meetings, the scholarship holders of the Hastor Foundation are not infrequently given an opportunity to listen to the inspirational life stories of successful people and after hearing each of them we can note that all of these recipes for success do have something in common. At our June meeting we learned that success can never simply fall in one's lap. The prerequisite of success is plenty of hard work, effort and perseverance, and an additional gust of wind in one's sails comes from love, support, as well as chance. Our guest reminded us of

the great importance of our Foundation, and we can particularly point out the enormous value of personal connections we make. Each month our scholarship holders have an opportunity to meet somebody who is more than 50 or 100 kilometers away from them, or at an even greater distance. This is a place where you make friends for life, friends who are, despite the little differences that make us unique, brought together by the Hastor Foundation – a thread which connects all of our hearts.

“The team we had with them was ideal. They were always nice and there for us whenever we needed help. They prepared my colleagues and me for future, independent work, from writing the reports to holding these meetings”, say the pupils whose mentors were Nermina and Samra.

Volunteering is something you learn in through life, but what remains after it is what we chose to take. Indeed, the Hastor Foundation has a special connection with all its scholarship holders, and this is what makes it unique. Nermina and Samra are just another proof that education is the choice of the winners, more precisely grateful scholarship holders who remained the Hastor Foundation's continued support, despite achieving victories in life.

Ammar is a third-year student at the Sarajevo Music Academy, Department of string instruments and guitar, and he has been the Hastor Foundation's scholarship holder for nine years. Wanting to try and learn something new, he applied for the Erasmus Programme by sending a video of one of his guitar performances and soon received a positive answer.

Thanks to the Erasmus Programme, this year he had an opportunity to visit Spain, particularly Vigo, a city near the border with Portugal, and attend classes at the University of Vigo. During his stay in this Spanish city, he had one solo concert and four performances and still managed to pass all the exams.

For this month's Do It Yourself section, our scholarship holder [Berina Brakovic](#) sent us a suggestion for decorating objects with pasta luce and acrylic paints.

Needed materials and supplies:

acrylic paint, pasta luce, varnish, stencil, paintbrush, tool for applying pasta luce, the object we are working on



MAKING PROCESS:

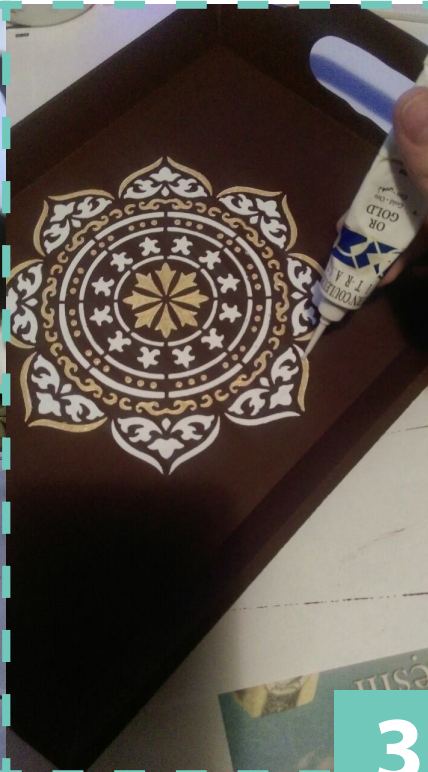
Paint the wooden object with acrylic paint and let it dry.

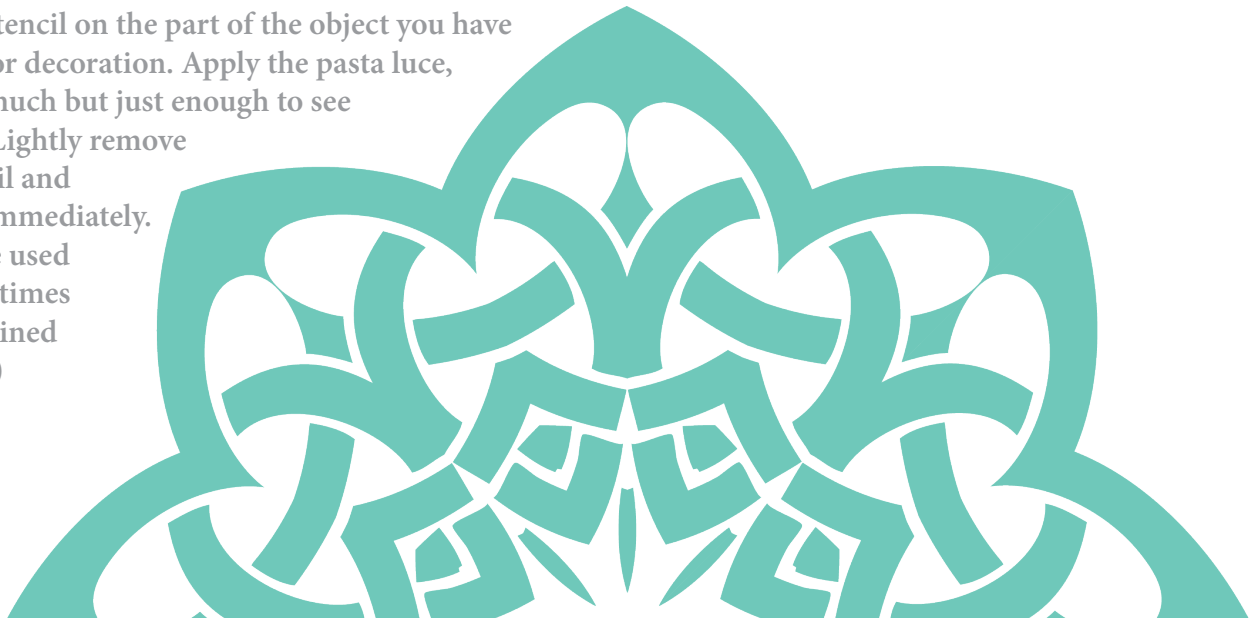

Let the pasta luce dry. (color it if you wish, on the saucer shown in the photo some parts are colored with golden contour paint)

Fix irregularities if there are any and let it dry properly.

Put the stencil on the part of the object you have chosen for decoration. Apply the pasta luce, not too much but just enough to see a bulge. Lightly remove the stencil and clean it immediately. (it can be used multiple times if maintained properly)



Varnish the object (you can do it several times, for example I always make three layers for better protection of the object, because besides giving a shiny coating to the object, the varnish also protects it)

Let it dry. (approximately 24 hours is needed for the varnish to dry completely)

You can use hairdryer if you want. If the acrylic paints are too thick it would be great to thin them with water.

Time needed: approximately 2 hours.

TEACHER'S SECTION

Few days ago Seid told me that at the end of May and the beginning of June he visited 109 families from 27 municipalities and did 5,900 kilometers to check the validity of the paperwork sent for the Hastor Foundation's scholarships. I acknowledged his effort and told him that at the same time and for the same purpose I visited 181 families from 36 municipalities and did 5,200 kilometers. I also told him that Amela and Faruk did their part as well: they visited applicants from Ilidža, Hadžići and Sarajevo, 43 families precisely, and did several hundred kilometers. We concluded that the Hastor Foundation is ready to admit another 333 primary and high school pupils this year. Along with the growing number of the Hastor Foundation's scholarship holders, the number of students who are delivering great results at their faculties is growing as well. We have many students like Željko Simeunić from Čečava who wrote: "I've passed three exams till yesterday and one today which means I've completed this year!" Amin Sejfić from Čapljina says: "I've passed six exams, and I've got all As!"



This shows that they have accepted the Foundation's practice not to speak of what will be done but of what has been done.
