The start of the commemoration of the 15th anniversary of the Hastor Foundation: the monthly meeting of the students – scholarship holders



On Saturday, 17th April of the current year, the scholarship holders of the Hastor Foundation have symbolically commemorated the 15th anniversary of Foundation's work. Considering that this is the first monthly meeting since the Foundation acquired 46 new scholarship holders, the meeting began with the presentation of characteristics and the mission of the Foundation itself, since its very conception up to today.

Investing in knowledge and schooling

The Director of the Foundation, Seid Fijuljanin, began the presentation by mentioning that on this anniversary of fifteen years, it is his pleasure and honour to return to the very beginning and once again remind everyone that the Hastor Foundation was formed with the goal of helping the youth of Bosnia and Herzegovina through education, and that the Foundation works with the same goal in mind today as well.

The original desire to invest in the knowledge and education of young people, who were at that time elementary and high school students, had the aim of distributing the acquired knowledge and experience. This main idea is yielding results today. Thanks to a system designed in such a way that senior scholarship holders transfer their knowledge, experiences, and ideas to younger scholarship holders through the volunteering process, the Hastor Foundation today boasts a large number of successful young people who achieve outstanding success in all fields. This meeting was an opportunity to remind everyone through positive examples from previous years how active the Hastor Foundation scholarship holders have always been. Through volunteering, they first created and then realized numerous ideas and joint projects in their local communities.

Actions such as these have a more noble meaning considering that the scholarship holders feel an attachment to their community since their early childhood. Later, that attachment motivates them to preserve, maintain, and never leave the community. Those are only some of the specific details by which the Foundation is differentiated from other similar organizations.

These were just some of the specifics by which the Hastor Foundation stands out from other similar organizations. The meeting also drew attention to the fact that fifteen years ago, the Hastor Foundation committed itself to philanthropy, working with young people and their professional and personal development. This is also expected from their scholarship holders.

Among other things, the meeting discussed how the Hastor Foundation, as a unique phenomenon in our country, has always dealt with the essence, not the form. That is why, through volunteering as its most important segment, it created a network of young, ambitious and creative people, who help each other, exchange information, and thus improve our society.

Emrah Tepić

The best indicators of success in the work of the Hastor Foundation are the successes of its scholarship holders.

One of our scholarship holders, Emrah Tepić, exemplifies the virtues that all of our scholarship holders possess - entrepreneurship, commitment, willingness to work, and commitment to volunteer activities. In accordance with his dedication, he holds the title of the scholarship holder of the month of the Hastor Foundation.



Emrah's story begins in Bihać, where he was born. Since he's been blind from his birth, he constantly faced various forms of discrimination and prejudice. Despite that, he never lost his spirit and, as he says, he always tried to find happiness.

For the sake of schooling, in 2005 he came to Sarajevo with his family. He received his primary and secondary education at the Centre for the Blind and Visually Impaired Children and Youth. Despite certain health problems, he was an excellent student during his education at the Centre and always fulfilled his obligations regularly. He is currently a student at the Faculty of Political Science, Department of Political Studies, majoring in Government Management. Emrah says that, although it is the final year of the first cycle of studies, that will not stop him from pursuing further education in this field. He plans to continue his master's studies at the same faculty. The Foundation provides a lot of support for him:

I see the Hastor Foundation as one big family and my second home. It played a big role in my life. Thanks to the Foundation, my self-confidence improved, and I got an optimistic outlook on life. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Hastor Foundation for making us winners, great and successful people. It is always there for us and accompanies us throughout our lives.

He has been a scholarship holder of the Foundation for five years. It was the basis for his volunteer engagement because it was through the Foundation that he became acquainted with volunteering. Thanks to the Foundation, Emrah became a member of other associations such as the Association of Blind of Canton Sarajevo, the initiative "Give us a Chance", the association "Independent Step" and the Office of Student Support. But the story of him does not end here. He also became a member of a project called My Job, led by a Czech humanitarian and development organization of a project called People in Need.

The goal of this project, as Emrah states, is economic empowerment and employment of people with disabilities. Also, as part of this project, the campaign "I want to be part of society" was recently launched. This campaign aims to raise awareness among the general public of Bosnia and Herzegovina about the rights and equality of persons with disabilities.

On the motivation to volunteer during the COVID-19 pandemic, Emrah reveals:

Volunteering during the pandemic is quite a difficult challenge for me, considering that everything takes place online, and for me as a blind person, working in person means a lot. In my online work, a big problem for me is that don't have any physical contact with people. To me as a blind person, the physical presence of a person means a lot. Before the pandemic, my mentor Irena Karamehmedović came to me and we were able to do volunteer tasks within the Foundation. Irena also helped me with my college assignments and the results were outstanding.



The Hastor Foundation is proud that its team is made up of young people like Emrah, who with optimism and great self-confidence are heading straight into the future, making big steps along the way.

ELMA HASANSPAHIĆ

Elma Hasanspahić is a first-year student at the Faculty of Economics, University of Zenica and has been a scholarship holder of our foundation since 2018. Elma points out that she is proud that the Hastor Foundation was the first step she took towards her activist engagement and that she now understands the importance of volunteering and contributing to the community.

Becoming a scholarship holder of the Hastor Foundation and starting with the meetings, which were held live at the time, the two 5-hour weekends were an escape from any kind formality for me as I slowly entered the world of non-formal education.

During that period, Elma attended the third grade of her Economics High School and made the decision to join her school's Student Council because she began to critically analyze the things that required change. At the first session, she was elected as the president of the Student Council of the Economics High School in Zenica. For her, a seventeen-year-old, this was one big responsibility, since the school had four hundred students at the time.

The next step on her path of activist engagement was the Network of Student Councils of Zenica-Doboj Canton, which started molding Elma into a hearty activist. It was here that the first fruits of her labor began to be seen. The following year, she was elected to the same position, thus rewriting the history of the school - no one had performed that function for two years in a row before.

The Association of High School Students in Bosnia and Herzegovina (ASuBiH) provided wonderful memories to many high school students. Elma is no exception. By becoming a member, she was given the opportunity to travel across the country and participate in many camps and seminars that were extremely important for the development of her leadership skill and many similar skills. For some time, she was a member of the world's largest youth organization AIESEC, which provided her with a large amount of knowledge in the field of project management.

I can freely say that the pandemic has done its thing and that most activities have been moved to the online sphere, but I still try to contribute to my community and encourage others to do the same. The contribution that I am most proud of is participating in the implementation of the initiative of the Youth Center Zenica, where I was trained as a manager. Today Zenica has a functional space that brings together all young people in this community. Participating in this story made me really proud.

Even as a child, Elma fantasized about the stage and herself on the boards that represent life, and this year she got the opportunity to do that. After an audition, she got a role in the play "Youth in the Age of Corona", where she was able to express her dissatisfaction as a young person who went through a pandemic. The goal was to convey to people the message of how young people feel in a time like this. She is immensely grateful to the Studio Theater, which awakened in her an even greater love for the theater and in which she met wonderful people. She is currently a member of the Board of Directors of that same theater.



At the beginning of 2021, my colleagues and I started a new non-governmental organization in Zenica called "Rotaract Club", which operates within the Rotary Club Zenica, where we try to point out the importance of volunteering and community engagement to our members.

In addition to everything we just stated, Elma has acquired many certificates, won many debate competitions and hackathons and made many beautiful memories during these three short years. In the end, what's especially important is that she doesn't intend to stop here. In her opinion, it is very important for young people to be active members of their community. She says that because she truly believes in the saying that the world rests on young people. She sees us young people as those who must change society.

As I already mentioned, the Hastor Foundation was my first step towards and the foundation of my activist engagement, which I am immensely proud of. I am proud that the Foundation extends throughout the entirety of my activist engagement. It is always there for me and encourages me and I definitely consider it my biggest supporter throughout my journey. My message for the Foundation's scholarship holders is - the best project you will have the opportunity to work on is yourself. That is why it is important that you work on yourself, your skills and competencies, realize the importance of volunteering and non-formal education, and that you develop critical thinking abilities and change the society in which you live.

HOW TO LEAVE A POSITIVE FIRST IMPRESSION?

In the 21st century, success during your education is not enough to make you attractive on an international level, level of study or employment.

It is not uncommon to see and hear that young people who have recently graduated or obtained a master's degree are unemployed, even though they sent in their biographies (Curriculum Vitae) for several job applications. Fewer and fewer young people know how to use the online resources that they have at their disposal (eg. using e-mail correctly). Educations, seminars, exchange programs are this section's goals, but it also strives to show how students on the international level work on their own improvement.

In today's society, when just a few seconds are enough to make an impression of someone, it is very important to know how to use those few seconds to your advantage in the right way. First impressions can very easily be crucial for your desired employment, internship opportunity or participation in an informal educational seminar. This month, through the "Let's be (more) competitive!" section, we will give you a few tips on how to leave a positive first impression.

Choose your clothing combination carefully!

For a good first impression, it is very important to carefully choosethe clothing combination, clothing colours and shoes.

If you wear an item of clothing (e.g. jacket, shirt) that does not fit you perfectly or is a number higher or lower, it can have a negative effect on the person on the other side of the conversation. Appropriate clothing in a size that suits you ideally will leave a far more positive impression of you as a confident, flexible and successful person. Shoes are also important for a positive first impression - if they are not clean and suitable for choosing clothes, they can leave the impression that you are lazy or careless, which you certainly do not want. Neatness is often associated with conscientiousness, so it is extremely important to pay attention to the fact that both clothes and shoes are neat. The choice of clothing colour is still a matter of personal preference, but research shows that among the respondents who got the desired job, the most selected colours are black and blue. However, it is important to keep in mind that the choice of colours needs to be adapted to the occasion - if you are applying for a creative job, where diversity is nurtured, bright colours are not a bad option.

Handshaking is important!

The first impression, in addition to visual appeal, is also achieved by shaking hands when meeting.

Your handshake can say a lot about your character to the person you meet. Firm handshake is a sign of extroversion, emotional expression, but also ability and self-confidence. When shaking hands, it is advisable to make eye contact and smile at the person you are meeting. If your handshake is too strong, it can be a sign of aggression and a desire for dominance, and if it is too weak, it shows that you are insecure. That is why it is important to find a safe balance of the strength of the handshake.

Be friendly!

To make a positive first impression, it is extremely important that you are friendly.

If you are eye-catching and smiling, enthusiastic and optimistic, you will get the impression of an approachable person with whom it is easy to talk, and every employer certainly wants such a person in the team. Don't be afraid to reveal some of your personal tags or ask questions of the person you are talking to. When you ask questions, it gives the impression that you are actively listening to the interlocutor. Remember to mention the name of your interlocutor in the conversation, as this will give the impression that the person recognizes and appreciates him/her.

Come on time!

For a positive first impression, it is inevitable that you arrive on time, no matter who you want to leave a positive impression on.

It is ideal to arrive 10-15 minutes earlier, but not earlier than that, because the person (if you are waiting for an important conversation) with whom you are meeting could feel the pressure to hurry. What is important is not to be late, because being late gives the impression that you are unreliable and that the time of your interlocutor is not important to you, so you should rather start the conversation earlier due to possible traffic jams.
