




The Monthly Meeting of the Hastor Foundation Scholarship Holders

Volunteering - A Guarantee of Success

On Saturday, May 21 2022, an online monthly meeting of Hastor Foundation scholarship holders was held. A large number of scholarship holders from different parts of Bosnia and Herzegovina attended the meeting. All of them are united by one thing – their commitment to the Hastor Foundation. The meeting was dedicated to volunteering, the way we conduct our volunteer meetings, and the importance of the relationships between mentors and junior students. It was led by students who excel in holding meetings with junior scholarship holders and this was a great opportunity to share their ideas and experiences with other scholarship holders - students.




At the very beginning of the meeting, the director of the Hastor Foundation, Seid Fijuljanin, addressed all those present and introduced them to the topic of the meeting with a speech on the importance of education and volunteer work.

After the introduction of the director, Almedina Fadžan, a student of radiological technologies at the Faculty of Health Studies in Sarajevo, took the floor. She believes that thorough preparation is key to a successful meeting and says mentors need to choose topics that they are familiar with, so that they can share their knowledge with younger scholarship holders. In addition, the mentor should be a person who will provide emotional support to younger scholarship holders and show them that they always have someone to talk to.

Luciana Martinović from Široki Brijeg also emphasized the importance of healthy communication with scholar-ship holders. The focus of Luciana's speech was the idea of giving younger scholarship holders the opportunity to choose the topics that will be covered at the meetings. She ends the meetings with her group with student presentations, which teaches them public speaking, and they will certainly need that throughout all stages of life.

Another active volunteer and scholarship holder of the Hastor Foundation is Lejla Dučević-Mujkić, a student at the Faculty of Pharmacy in Tuzla. At the very beginning of her speech, Lejla pointed out that students should have a friendly approach to other scholarship holders and that this is the secret of good cooperation. She likes to organize more shorter meetings during the month because she believes that students quickly lose focus during the longer meetings and that the conversation stops being effective. She prepares mind maps for meetings that make it easier for students to learn and remember what they have learned. At the end of her presentation, Lejla mentioned that students read the newsletter with their groups because they can draw inspiration and motivation to improve their local environment.

Psychology student Senada Avdagić also stated that the conversation with high school and elementary school students of the Hastor Foundation is the most important component of volunteer meetings. She, along with her colleague Azra Korjenić, organizes meetings consisting of several parts that include presentations, critical exercises, and guizzes. Senada emphasizes that guizzes have proven to be the most interesting part of the meetings and advises all students to take her example of making knowledge guizzes. As an important segment of the meetings, Senada cites assistance to younger scholarship holders in mastering their school materials, because in this way the Foundation will contribute to their progress and achieve notable results, and younger scholars will find role models and supports in their mentors. Lastly, she advised that in addition to regular introduction of the topic, students should be provided with assistance in overcoming school obligations, if the need arises.

Another scholarship holder who addressed the meeting was Semra Nešust, a student who is currently volunteering as a member of the administrative team. Because she was very successful while doing volunteer duties holding meetings with students, she shared her experiences with other students. She believes that the topics should be

adapted to the age of the scholarship holder. Another important component to consider when choosing a topic is certainly student feedback. The topics they pay more attention to serve as a model for choosing new topics. Semra ended her presentation with an emotional story that helped students better understand the importance of getting closer to their group of students.

At the end of the meeting, a speech was given by Irfan Brakić, a member of the monitoring team, who listed some of the problems that this team encounters when monitoring meetings. This helped both sides understand what they need to improve when cooperating and will definitely improve their communication.

Each meeting with students carries important messages that remain in their memory as a guide through the future. They learned a lot from each other, ensuring that the volunteering in the following period maintains a serious level. It has been developed and improved in previous years in order to benefit all scholarship holders of the Hastor Foundation, but also those who follow its work.

We can proudly say that as of this year, the Hastor Foundation is richer by as many as 42 new scholarship students who, with their ambition, will undoubtedly greatly contribute to the achievement of its goals. This month as well as the next, we will be extremely pleased to present our new scholarship holders and welcome them once again to the Hastor Foundation.




Petra Bračić


Daria Ćosić





In Bosnia and Herzegovina, the "working memory" are just proactive and diligent young people who are an example of the society that our country needs. Through this section, we will present active and young scholarship holders of the Hastor Foundation who, in addition to volunteering, do phenomenal things and thus represent the Foundation in the best light!

Derviš Klokić

Derviš Klokić is a fourth-year student at the Faculty of Law, University of Banja Luka. He comes from Lišnja, a place in the municipality of Prnjavor. Derviš finished elementary school and high school in Prnjavor and has maintained excellent grades throughout his schooling. He points out that during his high school education he worked to be a useful member of his community, and he found inspiration to follow that path and help others in the work of the Hastor Foundation.







Derviš reminds us that our folks have one very bad custom, and that is to dump garbage in places that are not intended for it. Because of such behavior, illegal dumps began to form in his town. When he noticed that, he tried to remove garbage from his local community through independent work or planned activities, and he tries to motivate his fellow citizens to follow his example and do the same.

In addition to this activity, during the first outbreaks of the COVID-19 virus, Derviš made himself available to his community. Namely, at the beginning of the pandemic, an informal group of young people was formed who made themselves available to fellow citizens to deliver the necessary things, especially to the elderly, for whom every outing and contact with other people posed a special danger. In this way, they tried and, to some extent, succeeded in protecting their fellow citizens. At the same time, he participated in the action of distributing basic foodstuffs to the elderly and people in need.

In addition to these activities, he has been an active member of the religious community in his town for many years. He is very proud of this fact because he believes that faith provides support to man in good and bad times, and we should, no matter what denomination we are, make a contribution in that area as well. During the month of Ramadan, he also helped organize iftars.

In addition to the above, I am especially satisfied with working with my volunteer group. Although I have never shown a talent for working with young people before, I was assigned a volunteer group of about 15 students after enrolling in college. Elementary school students were in that group. Working with one such group was a great challenge because the range of years required different knowledge and understanding of certain topics.

Over the next few years, I have been perfecting my skills and I am currently at a level that is quite high for me personally because I never expected to reach it. I am especially happy that the members of my volunteer group enjoy and gladly participate in the work and that they understand volunteering not only as an obligation but also as additional training. I am also pleased that the parents are satisfied with me and the work of my colleagues and that we have achieved a co-operation with them at an enviable level.

Our scholarship holder believes that the activity of young people is crucial for the community. Sometimes he is angry at the fact that his peers are passive, but he is happy that he is trying to improve the environment in which he lives.

He believes that all of us, Hastor Foundation scholarship holders, enjoy privileges that are not only reflected in financial aid but also in the support we receive. Derviš has been a scholarship holder for 10 years and sees the Hastor Foundation not only as an organization but as a family, safe hands to which we can always return. He especially appreciates the fact that as a scholarship holder he builds a quality personality inspired by everything that the Hastor Foundation does for its scholarship holders. He sees its success mainly because its fellows become useful members of the community and good people, and he says that this is more important than academic success, which undoubtedly has its special value.

Mirza Murga is originally from Livno and he graduated from the Elementary school "Fra Lovro Karaula", and then the Gymnasium Livno in his hometown. After high school, he enrolled and graduated from the Faculty of Dentistry with the clinics of the University of Sarajevo. After graduating, he was in dilemma whether, like a large number of young people, to leave the country and accept one of the offers abroad or make a step forward and try to pursue a career in his hometown. Mirza decides for the latter and returns to Livno, where the story of his career development begins.

He was a scholarship holder of the Hastor Foundation for a full ten years, during his entire high school and academic education.



As a Hastor Foundation scholarship holder, I felt the greatest support during my studies. I felt I had the backbone and support in the new city I came to study. Through the Foundation, I learned a lot about discipline in working and understanding others. INTERESTING FACTS

Göbekli tepe - an archaeological shrine in Turkey

Until now, we knew that the oldest excavations are related to the Euphrates and Tigris rivers or Mesopotamia. This fact was valid until 1994, when a German archaeologist made a significant milestone in the field of historical research. He discovered a shrine in Turkey that is older than Stonehenge and all the original cities in Mesopotamia.

It is important to point out that every civilization built its own buildings, and in the earliest times they were mostly related to religion, such as Parthenon, an ancient temple dedicated to the goddess Athena. Examples include ziggurats, ancient temples built mainly by the Sumerians in the area of former Mesopotamia in 2000 BC. n. e. In Europe, more precisely in the south-west of England, we have the example of Stonehenge, a monument that is considered to have served for religious ceremonies, and was made 3000 years BC. n. e. Gobekli Tepe (or Potbelly Hill) is located in the south of Turkey, near the Syrian border. It is an archeological site of a Mesolithic sanctuary and the oldest example of monumental architecture. This archeological site consists of a T-shaped monument six meters high. Gobekli tepe can, in fact, be considered a kind of miracle, given the fact that it originated at a time when civilization had not reached the level of development as we know it today. At that time, hunters were the most active

"researchers" and collectors, so, accordingly, it is assumed that they are the ones who built the Gobekli tepe. Due to the nature of the site, the name Belly Hill is also used.

A team of researchers from England found the bones of wild animals - gazelles, red deer, pigs, goats, sheep and oxen, various species of birds - scattered around this location. Most of these animals are shown on these plates in the shape of the letter T. This group of scientists believes that the monuments were built by some advanced civilization and that it is not possible that hunters did it as it was thought. These plaques, according to English scientists, were a pilgrimage and were visited by believers from other parts.

This site has provoked many debates. In order to be able to draw conclusions, more determinations and research are needed, and we have no doubt that this will be realized with newer techniques and advances in technology. In any case, this discovery represents a new beginning in archeology, a great challenge and a real tourist attraction.


