THE SIGNING OF CONTRACTS WITH STUDENTS FOR THE 2023/2024 ACADEMIC YEAR

The end of October 2023 was marked by the signing of scholarship contracts with students, beneficiaries of the Hastor Foundation, for the 2023/2024 academic year. The signing ceremony was attended by our longstanding scholarship recipients, including students in their final year of college, for whom this was the last signed contract. Additionally, a significant number of freshmen, whom Hastor Foundation has supported the through primary and secondary education, also participated, marking their first signed scholarship contracts. The signing ceremony also featured the presentation of an enhanced volunteering model.

From the beginning of its operation, the Hastor Foundation has consistently assisted and supported the development and education of young individuals. One of its most recognizable components is volunteering. Starting this year, a new volunteering model has been created to further enhance this aspect. After signing the contracts, students underwent training for their upcoming volunteer engagement. The training aimed to better prepare students for theirvolunteerroles, enabling them to navigate future responsibilities more effectively and transmit their knowledge more adequately to younger generations.

All scholarship recipients have been assigned to appropriate volunteer teams and clubs based on their field of interest or study. In addition to financial assistance throughout the year, they will have the opportunity to enhance their knowledge and skills through volunteer engagement. This not only makes them more competitive in the job market but also allows them to contribute to others and make their local communities better places to live.

At the contract signing, the director Lejla Donlagić addressed the scholarship recipients, along with longtime volunteers Amela Dedić and Maida Sarić. They collectively wished all scholarship recipients success in the upcoming academic year and emphasized the valuable and essential role they play in their communities. This is best reflected in the results they achieve through their volunteer engagement. The Foundation stressed its commitment to recognizing, promoting, and valuing every step the students take to rise above average, highlighting the importance of accepting and maximizing the opportunities the Hastor Foundation offers its scholarship recipients during their education and beyond, providing numerous paths for their first employments.

As the new academic year begins, a large number of scholarship recipients have completed their education, concluding their formal sponsorship. However, they have not left the Hastor Foundation family. They have now entered the Alumni Club, through which the Foundation will continue to monitor their professional progress and take pride in empathetic and capable young individuals and their successes. Signing contracts has not concluded the admission of students for the 2023/2024 school year. Soon, new students will join the Hastor Foundation's family through the Talented Students Competition, which is currently in progress.

This month, we will complement the story of goals and successes by introducing Almedina Mušanović, a talented fourth-year student of Health Nutrition and Dietetics at the Faculty of Health Studies, University of Sarajevo. 11 EE

She was born in 2001 in Sarajevo, completing elementary school in Ilijaš and the Medical High School Jezero in Sarajevo. Throughout her education, she stood out with exceptional success. Until the age of seventeen, she actively and very successfully engaged in athletics, winning significant awards and medals at numerous competitions. However, due to academic obligations and an accelerated pace of life, she stopped pursuing "the queen of sports". She is also a member of the Association of Nutritionists of Bosnia and Herzegovina, actively collaborating on specialized projects, which are her primary field of education and additional professional experience.

Almedina became a scholarship recipient of the Hastor Foundation in the early days of high school and has been actively involved in its work and activities since then. She learned about the Foundation and its noble goals through her mother's friend and decided to apply for the scholarship. Her first volunteering experience was in the mail protocol team, and her effort, hard work, and dedication brought her recognition and a prominent role in the team. As she emphasizes, the experience of volunteering in mail protocol provided her with new knowledge and skills, considering that dozens, and sometimes hundreds, of envelopes need to be reviewed and processed at the Hastor Foundation's address. After completing the Secondary Teacher Training School, she enrolled in the Faculty of Education in Sarajevo, specializing in primary education. After a four-year study, she pursued a master's degree at the same faculty. Currently, she works as a teacher at the Third Elementary School in Ilidža. Before her teaching position, she worked as a teaching assistant for children with developmental difficulties. She has been a scholarship recipient of the Hastor Foundation since its early days, dating back to 2006.

> Discovery of the Hastor Foundation came, believe it or not, from newspapers. In today's digital age, this sounds unreal, but the idea of becoming a scholarship recipient seemed unreal to me until I received a call, informing me of the time and place for signing the contract. Thus, in 2006, I became a proud scholarship recipient of the Hastor Foundation.

Irma still remembers her first experience with the Hastor Foundation and all the visits by teacher Ramo, whose mention brings a smile to the faces of many scholarship recipients, now established and successful individuals.

From the very beginning of her education, Irma was driven by great love for children and a desire to help them achieve their life goals and dreams. Due to all of the above, she speaks about her job with special emotions:

> Being a teacher is a great challenge for me. It does not mean you just have to be a teacher – you are a role model, a person in whom little eyes see a superhero with solutions to all problems. You are a person ready to dream and constantly respond to a multitude of questions. A teacher is always learning, preparing for new generations that always come with new interests and desires. Therefore, being a teacher is much more than an ordinary profession.

Receiving any scholarship financially eases the period of studying for oneself and one's family. The Hastor Foundation, like for many others, for Irma was not just a source of financial assistance; it provided her with professional support, recommendations, and volunteering opportunities. It contributed to making her who she is today and realizing some of her dreams.

Irma fondly recalls her volunteering at the Foundation. During her volunteer work, she gained new knowledge, skills, and learned many things that still help her in working with children. Volunteer hours in the field and working with elementary school children hold a special place in her heart.

I volunteered in various places, such as the Prača–Sarajevo route, which sometimes took more than two hours. We would be tired, but on the way back home, you forget about the fatigue – you feel special, realizing that you helped others that day with your work.

Our alumna of the month has strong memories tied to the Hastor Foundation, where she was a scholarship recipient for five years. Every meeting, trip, field visit, and informal gathering of scholarship recipients brought a new story, new acquaintances, and new friendships. With a monthly volunteer engagement, scholarship holders of the Hastor Foundation demonstrate their commitment to creating positive narratives in our country. Mentoring is a key aspect in the educational process and individual development of scholarship holders. Within the framework of the Hastor Foundation, a unique opportunity is offered to young people to demonstrate their inherent talents and qualities, whereby continuous work is singled out as an essential component in achieving the mission of the Hastor Foundation. This element is illustrated through an inspiring story about volunteer work in Živinice, told by **Emina Nukić**, a mentor whose selfless commitment to volunteering brings an invaluable contribution to the Hastor Foundation.

The month of October is marked as Book Month. This period is dedicated to the culture of the written word and serves as an opportunity to promote reading culture and its positive impact on the intellectual and emotional development of society. The aim of the engagement is to encourage the development of awareness among individuals, emphasizing the importance of books as a source of knowledge and inspiration. Considering the above, Emina, with the help of the students with whom she volunteers, decided to take advantage of this months meetings, and contribute to the celebration of this important month.

is possible... -mentor Emina is also guided by this, so like every previous month, she joined forces with her students, successfully attracting our attention. What Emina points out is that during the preparation of each meeting, she tries to listen to the fellows if they have any interesting proposals and, if possible, fulfil them. Celebrating Book Month was one of the proposals, as well as celebrating Pink October. Their volunteer meeting included activities such as making small pieces of paper with beautiful and useful quotes, then making pink ribbons from satin ribbon, and at the very end a distribution made by random passers-by. The Amazon Rainforest, known as the "lungs of the planet", represents one of the most valuable natural resources on Earth. Its vast expanse and richness in plant and animal life make it a unique and irreplaceable ecosystem. The largest tropical rainforest follows the Amazon River, stretching 6,440 kilometers. With 10,000 tributaries, it is considered the world's richest river in terms of water volume. The first person to swim across it entirely was the Slovenian Martin Strel in 2007.

The name Amazon was given by the Spanish explorer and conquistador Francisco de Orellana, who was the first to explore this rainforest, led there by the Amazon River. Francisco explored this South American region and, during his journey, reached a jungle where he encountered groups of women whom he referred to as Amazon warriors. He named the rainforest after them, where he encountered them and engaged in conflict. The rainforest is inherently a dangerous place, and during Francisco de Orellana's time, it was even more perilous. Throughout his exploration, Francisco lost a significant number of crew members. The river



claimed many lives, and some succumbed to various diseases and wildlife. Francisco himself lost his life on one of his journeys through the Amazon, a place he visited multiple times. He was killed by one of the indigenous Indians using a poisoned arrow.²

This rainforest extends over an area of more than 5.5 million square kilometres, encompassing nine South American countries: Brazil, Colombia, Peru, Venezuela, Ecuador, Guyana, Bolivia, French Guiana, and Suriname. The largest portion, approximately 60%, is located in Brazil, where it is considered a national treasure. However, the Amazon Rainforest faces numerous threats. Unfortunately, both for Brazilians and all other inhabitants of the planet, the Brazilian government has recognized that it could achieve significant financial benefits through the excessive exploitation of the Amazon, and it is doing so.³

To preserve the Amazon Rainforest, creative and innovative approaches are necessary. One such approach is the promotion of sustainable agriculture. Additionally, it is crucial to educate the local population about the importance of rainforest preservation. Through education, we can raise awareness of the ecological values of the Amazon Rainforest and encourage people to actively engage in its conservation. Sustainable tourism can also provide economic support to local communities, motivating them to protect their natural resources. Furthermore, technology plays a significant role in the preservation of the Amazon Rainforest and encourage people to actively engage in its conservation. 


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
