## *A meeting was held with new student scholarship recipients of the Hastor*

January is the month of the beginning of many great things that await us in the year ahead! Like every time before, The Hastor Foundation is entering the new year with new ambitions, plans, and goals, as well as new scholarship recipients who will expand our great family and who will bring a breath of fresh air. Many new friendships will be made. Consequently, on Saturday, January 20th of the current year, a now-traditional meeting was held with the new student scholarship recipients of The Hastor Foundation. The goal of the meeting was to give them a chance to get to know each other, but also to learn about the concept of volunteering and volunteering engagements within The Hastor Foundation.

The director of the Hastor Foundation, Lejla Đonlagić, and the coordinator of the Department of Education and Development, Emra Kulo-Begić, welcomed all the students. At the very beginning of the meeting, the students got to know each other because The Hastor Foundation was always a place where you could meet new people and make new friends. After that, the director presented the mission, vision, and importance of The Hastor Foundation to the students. They learned about the long-term financial and mentoring support that The Hastor Foundation provides for children and young people, which thus contributes to building a more prosperous BiH society.

The director presented the importance of the volunteering process as the pillar of The Hastor Foundation, which was elevated to a high level in the last couple of years. She drew attention to the fact that the goal of the volunteering hours which are held every month is to awaken the most

beautiful human qualities in the scholarship recipients: empathy, a sense of belonging in a community, hard work, humanity, and a space to grow, perfect their skills, learn, and acquire new skills that make them more valuable in the labor market.

The new scholarship recipients of the Hastor Foundation were also given training led by Irma Lipovac, a long-time scholarship recipient who, as a mentor and coordinator, helps the scholarship recipients carry out their volunteer activities to the best of their abilities. In order to better prepare the scholarship recipients for future volunteering work, Irma presented the viewpoint of a student performing the volunteering to gain insight into how everything works. Irma, as someone who has been volunteering under the wing of The Hastor Foundation for a number of years, has passed her knowledge on to the new scholarship recipients and told them about ways to volunteer as best and as creatively as possible. She shared skills and advice with them and talked about pedagogical approaches during volunteer meetings as well as instructional classes. In this way, new scholarship recipients got a sense of The Hastor Foundation; they learned about the concept of work and the importance of volunteering to perform their work in the best and most effective way possible.



Our scholarship recipients did not hide their excitement about finally getting the chance to be a part of The Hastor Foundation and to leave their marks. Scholarship recipient Nermin Osmanović said:

## Amar Velagić



The role of the Hastor Foundation in lives of its scholarship recipients is immeasurable—a quality that scholarship recipients always highlight, stating how they were inspired to actively work on self-improvement. It is in the Hastor Foundation that many of them learn what volunteer work and its benefits are, and over time start promoting them through activism in their local communities. Many of them recognize the Hastor Foundation as an opportunity to apply the knowledge acquired at universities, but also as an opportunity to learn new things and broaden their horizons. One of them is **Amar Velagić**, who has recognized the Hastor Foundation as a space for personal growth, and he has been working hard to show that in his daily work and contribution to the Foundation.

Amar comes from Bugojno and he has been a Hastor Foundation scholarship recipient for more than ten years. He majored in the Latin Language, Roman Literature and Pedagogy at the Faculty of Philosophy, University of Sarajevo, and he is currently enrolled in the master studies of Pedagogy at the same faculty. For his effort, hard work and success at the end of the first cycle of studies Amar was granted the university acknowledgement The Silver Badge. Besides standing out with his academic achievements, Amar is also a manager of two collections of poems for young poets in Bosnia and Herzegovina, and he volunteered on various positions in non-governmental organizations and actively participated in numerous national and international projects.

Regarding his activism at the Hastor Foundation, Amar has had an opportunity to volunteer in countless ways. In the very beginning of his volunteer journey Amar was a mentor to a group of younger scholarship holders; for the last year he has been volunteering in the monitoring team of the Hastor Foundation, the type of volunteer work that includes online or in-person visits to mentor meetings so that we can get a clearer image of the ways our scholarship holders spend their volunteer hours. Another task of the monitoring team members is to evaluate the quality of activities that mentors do with their younger fellow scholarship recipients and to evaluate the significance that those activities hold for both mentors and mentees. After the visit to mentor meetings, the monitoring team have to write reports so that mentor meetings can be improved.



The Hastor Foundation recognized Amar's potential and hence, during the period of making a new volunteer model, included him in the volunteer activities of giving pedagogical and psychological as well as didactic-methodical guidelines to scholarship recipients volunteering as mentors. As Amar had the opportunity to share these competencies with his fellow scholarship recipients, he points out how it was his pleasure to see the Hastor Foundation guiding his scholarship recipients to their primary occupations and interests by enabling their life-long self-growth and development and by providing opportunities to practically apply the knowledge acquired at universities. Amar also shares with us how deeply thankful he is to the Foundation for restoring human dignity in countless ways.



***In my opinion, each and every one of scholarship recipients can continue promoting the principal aims that the Hastor Foundation sets, and we're always there for one another. Building the healthy collective spirit that was formed on the successful shoulders of an individual is the main factor in preserving our planet.***

Amar points out the positive influence the Hastor Foundation has had on his journey of success and education. For Amar personally the volunteer work in the Foundation has made him more responsible and aware that every job is based on continuity and specific habits and routines, but what is the most important in the Foundation is that it encourages humanity that isn't based on egoism, but rather on synergy, cohesiveness and empathy. 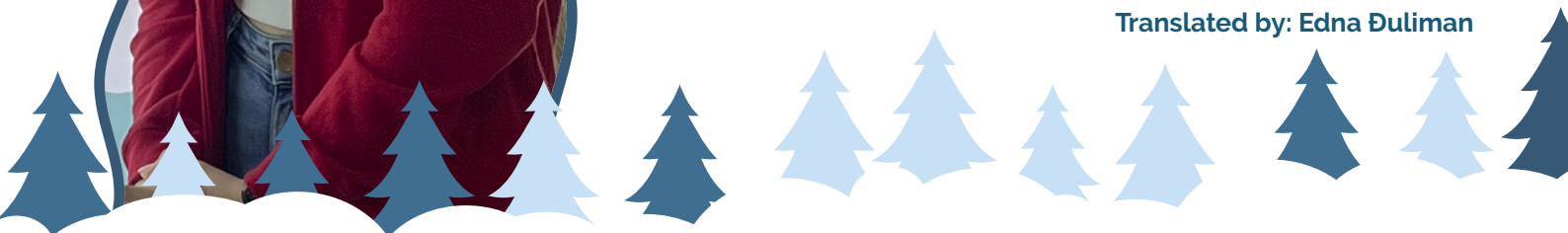

## Sanel Kopic



All our former scholarship recipients represent a wealth of success, and we always eagerly return to writing about them. Thanks to their paths after education, we aim to inspire our younger scholarship recipients to bravely follow in their footsteps and dream big dreams, striving to achieve them! In this month's bulletin, we bring you the life story of **Sanel Kopic**.

In the following article, find out how Sanel's paths intersected with the paths of the Hastor Foundation, what his volunteer tasks were and how he realized them, and how Sanel became an employee of one of the largest companies in Europe specializing in the production of cooling systems – "Daikin."

Sanel Kopic was born in Olovo, in the village of Čuništa. He completed elementary school in his hometown, and attended the Economic School in Olovo for high school. After completing high school, he enrolled in the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering, which was not his first choice, but he still chose it, following in his brother's footsteps. However, looking back over the years, he says he wouldn't change anything. In this story, the profession found him, and he currently enjoys his professional engagement. Sanel confirmed to us that love fundamentally changes life and makes the world a more beautiful place to live! He became a scholarship recipient of the Hastor Foundation thanks to his girlfriend. Although the period of studying and finding professional engagement was very challenging for both of them, it was just a small test that their love successfully passed, and today they fondly remember those times and the role of the Hastor Foundation in their lives as a married couple.

He always viewed the Foundation primarily as a family that is there to lend a hand in times of trouble, but also to provide an opportunity for him to support younger scholarship recipients through volunteer activities! Financial assistance, like for everyone, greatly eased the process of studying, but that is not the main reason Sanel remembers the Hastor Foundation.

In this month's newsletter, we bring you the story of the upward trajectory of Sanel's career. His path was by no means simple, and the journey of professional career growth and development was extremely dynamic and challenging. For several years now, he has been employed at the company "Tehnoelektronik," which deals with air conditioning, heating, and cooling. The job is tough and stressful, but Sanel feels fulfilled. His first work experience was in a printing house, and after completing his university education, he worked in Tuzla at the "Termoelektrane Tuzla" plant. Then, an offer came from "Tehnoelektronik," where Sanel continued to build his business career up to the present day.

*Regarding work experience, I believe that it is crucial to demonstrate work abilities or competencies in the workplace. It is something entirely different from what you hoped for. It's hard to land your dream job, the one you're satisfied with, if you sit at home and wait for it. You have to start somewhere, and with a clear goal and vision, you can surely reach where you intend to go.*



The impact of the Foundation was significant and helped Sanel become what he is today. Volunteer beginnings were undoubtedly very challenging, but everything is much easier when love weaves its threads. He fondly recalls all those challenges, improvisations, and volunteer hours spent with younger scholarship recipients of the Foundation, whom he mentored:

*As part of volunteer activities, I went to a village near Zvornik – Tršić, to hold monthly meetings with younger scholarship recipients. The biggest problem was organizing transportation, followed by walking to the village and overnight stays. All of this had to be done with minimal spending, which taught me a lot. Volunteering with younger scholarship recipients of the Hastor Foundation remains in special memory. It was a bit easier when I volunteered in a village near Olovo. I met scholarship recipients at the Foundation with whom I am still in touch, and we fondly recall some events from those times.*

Moments that Sanel will forever cherish and one of the most beautiful memories linking him to the Foundation is the time spent with other scholarship recipients while answering letters from students in the Foundation's offices, organizing social games, outings, and gatherings after meetings. Through volunteer tasks at the Foundation, Sanel acquired new work habits that absolutely helped him stand out in the job market. As Sanel himself says: **the market is big enough for everyone. We need to strive to be leaders in our business**

**field. Anyone can be average, but still, we need to keep up with the times and be competitive in larger job markets.** Sanel transferred the work habits from the Hastor Foundation to his business career, built on them, and thus secured a job at "Daikin".

Sanel revealed to us that the basic recipe for a successful career is communication with others, something he learned a lot about in the Hastor Foundation!

*However, in the end, we realize that the most important thing is to learn proper communication with colleagues and clients, and such experience can be gained during any business engagement. Experience in the field you are in naturally comes if you try hard enough.*

The message at the end of our alumni of the month is:



***From personal experience, I can advise scholarship recipients to take advantage of the opportunity in the Hastor Foundation to gain new experiences and work competencies through the opportunities that the Foundation generously provides, including volunteer engagement, as it will certainly enrich their resume and facilitate finding business engagement. The job market is big enough for everyone, but we must stand out in some way. The Hastor Foundation offers exceptional opportunities to perfect your abilities and easily build your personal and business path.***

The monthly meetings they have is the opportunity to serve as an excellent platform for developing diverse skills, acquiring new knowledge and experience, and, perhaps most importantly, providing them with the chance to positively influence the scholarship recipients they mentor in their voluntary meetings. The goal of our column "Small Stories of Great Volunteers" is to bring creative, inspiring, and astonishing stories from volunteering in the field. This month, we give you the opportunity to read the story of Maja Bojanić and her volunteer group. We also hope that this text will motivate you to do something that will truly fulfill you this month.

Maja Bojanić comes from Derventa and is a first-year student at the Faculty of Natural Sciences and Mathematics in Banja Luka, majoring in Mathematics and Computer Science. Maja learned about the Hastor Foundation at the end of the ninth grade of elementary school, and at the beginning of her high school education, she became a scholarship recipient.

***The Foundation has had a significant impact on my progress, and the most significant change I see is in my attitude towards community contribution and volunteering,*** emphasizes Maja as she recalls her beginnings.

What is specific about Maja's story is that she currently volunteers as a mentor to a third-year high school student in Derventa. In addition, she is a member of the Club for Technical Sciences, where she provides instructive lessons to students in need. Considering that this is her first year as a mentor, she notes that she has gained excellent experience and new acquaintances, but also learned to be more resourceful and creative. Both Maja and the scholarship recipient she volunteers with come from Derventa, a small town with not many





opportunities for community volunteering. However, the two of them always manage to carry out some nice and useful activities together. Maja mentions that it's quite unusual to work with only one scholarship recipient, but she certainly tries to prepare the meetings just as she would if she had more students. This month, Maja and her student spent their volunteering hours in the local community in a kindergarten in their town. Our mentor planned all of this with a special intention. Namely, the scholarship recipient she works with expressed an interest in enrolling in the Faculty of Preschool Education, so Maja decided to give her the opportunity to explore her desires and thoughts more deeply through this volunteering. Upon arrival at the kindergarten, they were assigned two older groups of children, aged 4 to 5 years.

Maja was in one group, and the scholarship holder, Erna, was in another. Together with the kindergarten children, they made New Year's decorations. Maja and Erna made sure to prepare everything needed for the decorations in advance and started crafting upon arrival. After that, they played with the children and tried to get to know what it's like to be a kindergarten teacher. At the end of their volunteering, they also helped prepare the children for nap time and left the kindergarten with wide smiles.

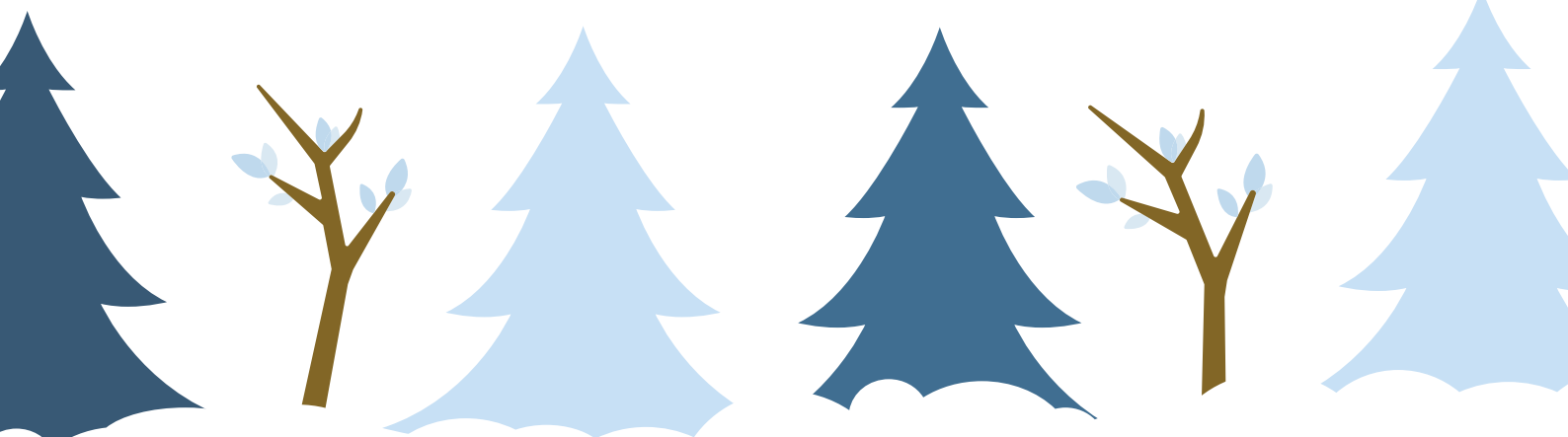
