Namely, the regular competition, through which the Hastor Foundation has awarded scholarships to thousands of students during its many years of operation, was intended for all students, with the greatest focus on the socio-economic status of students, while the new support program focuses on gifted and talented students who achieve outstanding results both in academic and extracurricular activities. In this way, the Hastor Foundation has opened its doors to yet another group of students and shown that it is a great support to students living in extremely difficult socio-economic conditions, as well as to gifted and talented students who work diligently and are ready to improve their own lives and the lives of others through education.

We are proud to announce that an exceptionally large number of gifted students from all over Bosnia and Herzegovina have recognized this opportunity and applied to our competition, receiving nearly 2,500 applications. Special attention should be paid to the fact that the Hastor Foundation is one of the few organizations in Bosnia and Herzegovina that, through this competition, has provided scholarship opportunities to students who excel in the fields of sports, arts, and science, in order to support them in achieving their goals.

Inthisway, the Hastor Foundation aims to provide an opportunity and support to all students of secondary and primary schools to confidently and self-assuredly achieve their successes and dreams. In the following is the story of Irma Lipovac, who, as she emphasises, managed to build her personality the way she always wanted it to be through her volunteer work, effort and desire, and has earned the title of Scholarship Recipient of the Month for her selfless dedication.

Irma Lipovac comes from Konjic. In her hometown, she completed elementary school, while she continued her high school education at the Second Gymnasium in Mostar. specialising in mathematics and computer science. Irma emphasises that she has nurtured a love for technical and natural sciences since childhood and that upon completing high school, she knew that her next destination was the Faculty of Electrical Engineering in Sarajevo. She is currently a second-year student in the Department of Automation and Electronics. Irma first learned about the Hastor Foundation six years ago from her friends who were already scholarship recipients.



When I heard about the mission and idea of the Hastor Foundation, I realized that I wanted to become a member, so as a freshman in high school, I received my first scholarship, but also the opportunity to engage in volunteer work and invest part of my time in helping my community and the people who live in it, says Irma.



At the very beginning, Irma was a student who had her mentors; however, upon entering college, a new chapter opened up for her the role of a mentor. As she says, she enjoyed working with students and strived to motivate them to always be ready to work, to learn to organize their time properly, and to strive to be the best version of themselves, as these are the qualities of winners, but also what the Hastor Foundation teaches us. Having excelled in her mentoring work with younger students, Irma now volunteers as a mentor coordinator, assisting other mentors in better preparing and implementing their volunteer activities, thus becoming better mentors to their students.



Being a member of a large organization and family like the Hastor Foundation is definitely a very pleasant experience for me. What I always emphasize as my favorite aspect of the Hastor Foundation is that it provides pupils and students with opportunities to gain new experiences and make new friends, says Irma, adding that during her volunteering, she has also gained many friendships that become more significant for her day by day.

Furthermore, volunteering at the Foundation has taught her not to ignore or overlook the problems and difficulties of the society she is in, but to always try to solve them, and it is precisely through this that the Foundation has enriched her personality and made her a more productive and independent individual.

## Layla Jusko



Erasmus of Rotterdam says that the greatest hope of any country lies in the adequate education of the youth. The Hastor Foundation is graced by young scholars who are equally committed to formal and informal education. The column of active young people is a space that serves to give a special kind of recognition to those who stand out in their academic, sports or other activities, so we proudly write and talk about them every month, and this time that honor went to Layla Jusko.

Layla Jusko lives in Sarajevo and is a fourthyear student at the Faculty of Political Science and International Relations at SSST University. In her free time, she deals with research in the spheres of population development, public health and climate change. From the older Hastor Foundation scholarship holders. whom she looked up to, she learned to use any knowledge she acquires at school or at studies for the purpose of improving the community. Thus, she carried out research related to breast and cervical cancer, on the basis of which the Karolinska Institute and the UNFPA (United Nations Population Fund) Regional Office for Eastern Europe and Central Asia declared her one of the best researchers in the field of population development and reproductive health in the wider area of Europe. Thanks to this recognition, she got the opportunity to be a representative of the youth of Bosnia and Herzegovina at the International Conference on Population Development (ICPD30) in Geneva, where she gave a speech as a representative of the academic community and young people from wider Europe.

Encouraged by the views of the Hastor Foundation that you should always go one step further and give your best in every field, Layla organized the first UNFCCC (United Nations Framework Convention on Climate



Change) youth conference for climate action in Bosnia and Herzegovina last year, during which they conducted research and based on feedback from young people, created the conference agenda for the purpose of raising awareness and educating young people regarding the topics of climate action, natural disasters, public and mental health, youth participation in politics



and decision-making processes, the role of media literacy and the role of climate action in building of peace.

Likewise, she got the opportunity to be a youth representative at COP28 (Conference of the Parties) within the delegation of Bosnia and Herzegovina and to share the perspective of young people from Bosnia and Herzegovina with decision makers from different countries.

Given that it was very important for her to have good role models, whom she eventually met at the Hastor Foundation, and that the Foundation's support in her research and progress meant a lot to her, she claims that she sees the Hastor Foundation as an opportunity to build bridges between generations through

the program mentoring and support in shaping a sustainable future, in which young people are empowered and motivated for lifelong learning. Therefore, Layla strives through various projects and initiatives to directly influence the lives of young people in her environment and to inspire them every day, just as she was inspired by the Foundation's older scholars.

She emphasises that at the Foundation, she realized that learning is the key to personal and collective progress and that it is necessary to be a proactive member of the community and flock to new knowledge and skills. The Hastor Foundation taught her to never give up, to always try to be better and to provide her knowledge and contribute to the community. because knowledge is not knowledge to know, but knowledge is knowledge to give. In this regard, she wants to encourage young people to value the learning process, which is lifelong:

> Don't be afraid to ask questions and explore. Learning is an inexhaustible treasure that enables personal and collective growth. Be curious, brave and open continuous learning to because it is in this process that the key to realizing your greatest potential lies.

## Nihada Šehagić





This month, meet **Nihada Šehagić** who always brings changes and positive energy to the community. Nihada Šehagić is a graduate engineer in medical-laboratory diagnostics. She succeeded through persistence and devotion. She was born in Bugojno, and today she lives and works in Zenica, where she has been contributing to the medical sector at the Zenica Cantonal Hospital for seven years.

Nihada started her education in Bugojno, in 2008. She enrolled to the Faculty Of Health Studies At The University Of Sarajevo. At that faculty, she obtained the title of master's degree in medical-laboratory diagnostics.

After several years of engagement in the private sector, Nihada found her place in Zenica Cantonal Hospital in 2016. Since then, she has been continuously contributing to the improvement of the medical sector and providing a great service to the patients. However, Nihada's contribution to the community is not only reflected in her occupation within the hospital walls, given that she was also an active volunteer and scholarship recipient of the Hastor Foundation for many years. Back then, she says, she recognized the importance of being a mentor and the importance of volunteering, especially by giving support to young people. Through The Hastor Foundation, she volunteered as a mentor to a group of 10 students in medical and dental high school, and she provided them with a lot of support through various activities. Through voluntary work with high school students. she often organized monthly workshops on a topic of their profession that she herself knew really well and loved very much. In that way, she provided help with overcoming the school curriculum. Her devotion to voluntary work was evident in the improved success among the younger scholarship recipients.







I became a volunteer and scholarship recipient of the Hastor Foundation back in 2011, and I learned about it thanks to a friend during my studies in Sarajevo. Through acquired experience and voluntary work in The Hastor Foundation I additionally developed empathy and I learned that being good to others returns to a person even when you least expect it.

She successfully finished Hastor Foundation development program seventeen modules: Quality system and code of business conduct, CV and motivation letter writing, Communication skills, Human resource management, Basics of sales and relationship with customers, Legal relations, Corporate communications, Basics of business law, Negotiation skills, Presentation skills, Team and teamwork, Basics of marketing, Basics of finance, Basics of office business, Basics of management, Basics of accounting and The role of IT in the business process. Most of these skills are beneficial to her today in daily work and, in general, are contributing to a successful business life, for which she will forever be thankful to The Hastor Foundation.

Preoccupied with precision in medicallaboratory diagnostics and dedicated supporting young people through volunteering, Nihada Šehagić from Zenica represents an inspiring example of a successful woman who simultaneously builds a career and spreads a positive influence in the community. Young women like Nihada are exceptional role models in today's society. Their professionalism, devotion and humanitarian work not only contribute to the professional sector but also inspire other young people to follow their path. Their stories are a reminder for young people to have strength and the potential to leave a mark on society by combining professionalism, work and social responsibility.

Besides professional life, this engineer is also finding satisfaction in making cakes and sweets in her free time. This gives her the opportunity to be creative and to spend quality time with her family. That gives her an opportunity to be creative and to spend quality time with her family.

At the very end, Nihada sends a message to scholarship recipients and students:

Consider success the satisfaction of your own state of mind. A free man is only one who has a free mind. The mental state of an individual is the starting point for achieving all life's successes - both on a personal and collective level.





## Lamija Slomić



This month in the section of positive stories from our volunteers, we bring you a new, unusual story that takes you to a new corner of the volunteering model of the Hastor Foundation. The fact that we are all one family characterized by mutual help and support for years is justified by the story below, which you will undoubtedly enjoy. Considering that the Hastor Foundation recently started implementing a new volunteering model, scholarship students, as part of their volunteer engagement through clubs with special assignments, provide tutorials and classes to scholarship students who have difficulties with certain school subjects or areas. One of the scholarship students volunteering with students through the tutorial process is our Lamija Slomić, whose experience we bring to you below.

Lamija Slomić comes from Čelić and she is a third-year student at the Faculty of Pharmacy in Tuzla. She is a member of the Health Studies Students Club, and for three years, she has been volunteering as a mentor to high school students.

Lamija emphasizes that her collaboration with students is at an admirable level due to the trust she always seeks to build from the outset.

Day by day, as she grew up, our interviewee became increasingly aware of the importance of the education process in the 21st century and developed a love for it. She strives to pass on this love to her students and encourage them to discuss higher education and the professions they are interested in. However, everyone sometimes experiences moments of decreased motivation, so Lamija emphasizes that she tries her best to be a motivation and guiding star to all her students through her examples because she is aware of her influence on their educational paths.

Lamija has fully dedicated herself to this form of volunteering, as evidenced by the good results of the students she has tutored. Believing that good preparation is half the battle won and a well-thought-out plan is the most important part of the journey to a certain goal, Lamija embarked on the process of creating a flexible plan for lessons to provide all students with the highest quality knowledge and learning techniques.





I always contact the students first to arrange the tutorial session, then they send me the topics they are studying in chemistry so that I can prepare for the tutorial. I always go through all the tasks in detail, and if there is any part I do not remember, I always review video clips on YouTube to ensure that I do not miss any details during the explanation and to better convey knowledge to younger scholarship recipients and make sure they understood what was explained.

She emphasizes that the theoretical part of the subject represents the first step in the tutorial process, then moves on to explaining the tasks they work on and practice together. Once she ensures that the student is ready for independent work, Lamija assigns practice tasks and homework for the students to work on independently. She thoroughly reviews all of this and gives her final assessment.

The feedback received after volunteering hours and tutorials is invaluable, and because of this, Lamija emphasizes that her favorite moment in this whole process is the final result in the form of improved grades for the students themselves.

Throughout our schooling, we have all encountered areas that we cannot quickly memorize and understand. In such situations, the help of older and more educated individuals is of utmost importance and serves as a light at the end of the tunnel for students. Guided by this very principle, the Hastor Foundation has embarked on a newly created volunteering model aimed at facilitating the educational process for scholarship recipients. How all of this looks from the perspective of students was recounted to us by student and scholarship recipient Erna Spahić:

Thanks to the instructions provided by Lamija, I achieved outstanding results in chemistry. Her support and expert guidance were key factors in my development. I am grateful for the opportunity to learn from her and achieve this success in my education. The result of the instructions was an A; a higher average grade in chemistry. I felt extremely satisfied

and proud when I achieved such results. The effort I put into studying paid off, and raising my average grade in this subject provided me with additional motivation for further success. And finally, I am extremely grateful to the Hastor Foundation for providing us with these instructions and helping us further our education and overcome certain obstacles.



Finally, Lamija reveals what the Hastor Foundation means to her and how the volunteering processes affect her:

I am grateful to the Hastor Foundation, which supports us in everything! Thanks to volunteering hours and the support of the Foundation, we adopt new knowledge, skills, exchange various experiences, get to know each other, make new friendships, and whenever we need help, we have someone to turn to.
