Signed scholarship contracts with candidates who have achieved the right to a scholarship under the Competition for gifted/talented students

In January 2024, with the aim of providing support to as many young people as possible for whom education is imperative, in addition to regular education, the Hastor Foundation announced for the first time a Competition for gifted/talented students of primary and secondary schools in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Marking the coming of age of existence, this time a step forward was made in many segments, and one of the most significant is certainly the publication of the aforementioned competition, which received close to 2,500 applications.

At the end of the competition procedure, the most successful students, with whom a meeting was held on March 30 of the current year, and the first scholarship contracts were signed, achieved the right to a scholarship. At the meeting, the director of the Hastor Foundation, Lejla Đonlagić, presented the past activities, mission and goals of the Hastor Foundation, as well as its long-term positive influence on Bosnian society. Director Đonlagić introduced the new scholarship recipients to the volunteering program and their future volunteer engagement within the Hastor Foundation and presented its benefits both for themselves and for the communities in which they live. The scholarship program was explained in detail to the new scholars and they were carefully informed about the future rights and obligations they will have as scholars of the Hastor Foundation.

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Many of them expressed satisfaction and pride at the fact that they became scholarship recipients, and positive impressions were also found among parents who expressed their gratitude considering that the Hastor Foundation provided gifted and talented students with the opportunity to continue working hard, learning and being better at what they do:

I want to thank the Hastor Foundation for the scholarship. Since Jovan became a scholarship holder of this Foundation, I, as a parent, feel proud and happy that he will have the opportunity to grow, mature and build friendships with other successful and valuable scholarship holders. The Hastor Foundation thinks of our children, rewards them for their efforts, so far those who are in a more difficult financial situation, and now, here, also those who are good athletes, students and artists. The future is in our children and we need more foundations like this in BiH, said Radosna Sladoje, the mother of our scholar Jovan.

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It is important to emphasize that by announcing the Competition for gifted/talented students, we did not neglect students from families with a more difficult socio-economic situation. For many years, the Hastor Foundation has been providing support to students from families with a more difficult socio-economic situation. In this school year alone, according to our regular competition, we received close to 400 elementary and high school students from all over Bosnia and Herzegovina, and the competition procedure is currently underway to select the students who will receive scholarships in the next year, 2025/26. school year.

According to our Competition for gifted/ talented students, a total of 93 students from all over Bosnia and Herzegovina were entitled to a scholarship, and we are pleased to emphasize that through the new support program of the Hastor Foundation, attention is also focused on gifted and talented students who achieve outstanding results in various fields of both curricular and extracurricular activities. In this way, the Hastor Foundation once again successfully achieved its goal of providing opportunities to students who work hard on their education in order to build a better and more promising future, as well as a positive environment for all of us.

Our new scholarship recipient Haris Halilović told us what it means for him to become part of the Hastor Foundation and how he sees its role in his future:

I am very happy to become one of the many winners of your valuable scholarship. I believe that I will have the opportunity to meet your many volunteers, scholarship holders, and that through active joint volunteer work, I will improve my organizational skills and become a valuable member of the Hastor Foundation, and contribute to the work of the local community by personal example.



Even our new scholarship recipient Iman Skrebo did not hide her enthusiasm and gratitude for the fact that she has the opportunity to develop within the Hastor Foundation:





She is currently a fourth-year-student majoring in Digital Communications and Public Relations at the Faculty of Education and Humanities, the International Burch University. Keep reading to discover Venesa's journey of success and the role the Hastor Foundation played in it.

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We realized through our interview with Venesa that young people like her truly value their time and use it in the best way possible. Free time and productivity for Venesa represent the time spent in quality aspects of her life that will inspire, fulfil and take her to the next level. She strives to help her community with her knowledge and positive change, and she views the Hastor Foundation as a space that aids her on that mission in various ways. Venesa currently volunteers as the social media team leader, and points out how she has developed her communication and leadership skills through this type of volunteer work; not only this, but as a student she also has had the opportunity to practically apply her knowledge. Volunteer work has significantly influenced Venesa's life and she says all the best about it:

I gained my first volunteer experience in the senior year of high school when I had become a member of the international non-governmental organization AIESEC. After that I began to search for more opportunities in my community; I was part of various non-governmental organizations such as PRONI – Center for Youth Development, the Rotaract Club where I was president, and the Erasmus Student Network. I have to specially mention my volunteer work at the Hastor Foundation, where I had the opportunity to acquire countless new skills and apply the knowledge gained at the faculty. Besides the mentioned volunteer work, Venesa has completed non-formal education programs such as SHL – Academy for Young Leaders in Civil Society, AFW – Academy of Political Literacy for Youth in Bosnia and Herzegovina and proposal writing training for BOLD projects. Thanks to the BOLD grant – Venesa being one of its recipients – she will participate in the project "CareerLeap Summit" that will be held in May this year. Venesa dances in her free time, and she has tried out numerous dance styles, some of them being classical, modern, Latina and social dances and character ballet. She was also part of the ballet ensemble at ArsCenter, Zenica.

Venesa didn't stop there. She used the opportunities that the Erasmus scheme offers to visit the Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary and other European countries. She is currently one of the two representatives for Bosnia and Herzegovina on the training for leaders of intercultural exchanges. This program is realized by OFAJ and VCV; the last stage of the program will be held in May this year in Serbia. Due to all the mentioned positive experiences, Venesa highlights the fact that she has, over time, become more approachable, openminded and very self-confident, and how her volunteer work at the Hastor Foundation has played a significant part in it because she faced various challenges and learned how to overcome them. She has learned to cherish differences, not fear new adventures and not give up when faced with challenges and obstacles.

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Venesa's message to her fellow scholarship recipients and other young people is to use the benefits of volunteer work, which is an ideal opportunity for them – she herself is an example of it. Thanks to the accumulated volunteer experience, Venesa got the opportunity to enroll in the faculty of her choice, which she is soon graduating from. Venesa has travelled a lot, met other cultures, and gained invaluable friendships and acquaintanceships which, for her, is the greatest treasure in life.

That job requires vigilance, and readiness to always research for new topics. That presented no challenge to Esma because she always looked up to her older student recipients in The Hastor foundation, who were always focused and ready for new challenges. Besides that, Esma volunteered as a mentor for a primary school student recipients.

As the Hastor Foundation is based on altruism and strives to transfer this to the scholarship holders, Esma, through her mentorship, selflessly transferred knowledge of the English language and other teaching subjects to the younger scholarship recipients. Further on, The Hastor Foundation recognised her potential, and she had a chance to volunteer in the administrative and editorial team, where she could show her skills and where she could work on further development of those skills. Because of a rich volunteer involvement most beautiful memories tie her only to The Hastor Foundation, and as a special memory she singles out a trip to the Netherlands, where she traveled as a guide for students who spent three weeks in the Netherlands.

Since those are younger children, to the many of them this was the first longer trip without parents. Guides were at the same time the translators and the replacement for the parents. In Netherlands Esma gained new acquaintances, and some of them grew into friendships that last to this day, so she also met her best friend at The Hastor Foundation. Her friendship bound is strong even today, and they hope their children will continue that friendship. Esma proudly tells her son now about The Hastor Foundation, with the desire to awaken in him the gratitude she feels because it was the Hastor Foundation that opened the door to the business world for Esma, and because of that she can provide a lot for him today, but also teach him altruism and pass on positive values to him from an early age.

I can say that the Hastor Foundation meant two things to me: support and a springboard to success. They supported me financially in the moments when it was needed the most, and it was the path to my own finances and professional experience of enormous importance. I point out proudly that I was a scholarship recipient of The Hastor foundation and I inform people about it, from which many of them didn't hear about it. 

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SMALL STORIES OF GREAT VOLUNTEERS



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When you step into the magical world of volunteering, you will notice that something keeps drawing you back to it time and time again. Some desire will lead you to forge new friendships, create new memories, and engage in many new activities. However, when we combine volunteering with what we truly love, it becomes our own little special world. Lejla Fejzić, a student and one of our scholarship recipients, had the opportunity to base her volunteer hours on what truly fulfills her, attracting our attention and undoubtedly earning her place in this column.

Lejla Fejzić is 22 years old and comes from Ilijaš, where she completed elementary and high school. She is currently a third-year student of graphic design and multimedia at the International Burch University. Although Lejla has been with us for only a year, when asked what being a Foundation Hastor scholar means to her, she didn't know where to start, stating that she has a lot to say.

Being a Foundation scholar is much more than financial support; it is an opportunity for growth and learning and a great privilege that allows me to focus on my education and contribute to the community with my work and give back the support I received.

Lejla's love for design and art dates back to her high school days, and as the Foundation Hastor strives to encourage its scholars to develop interests through volunteering activities, Lejla's entire volunteering is based on topics related to graphic design, about which she has much to say and teach others. The new volunteering model at the Foundation Hastor, implemented at the beginning of the current school year, provides the opportunity for scholarship students, among other things, to learn various skills by acquiring knowledge from various fields conveyed by our student scholars, thus expanding their horizons and ranges of knowledge. The workshops Lejla leads are envisioned as courses in Adobe Photoshop for our high school scholarship recipients, and our volunteer described to us what one of these workshops actually looks like.

At the very beginning, the students were tasked with installing the program necessary for the course, after which Lejla introduced them to all the options the program offers. One of the first challenges was to merge two photos into one and add some creative detail to the photo. Lejla emphasizes that in this way, she teaches younger scholarship recipients to be creative and to use the resources they have in the right way, and many of them already recognize the field of graphic design as their future profession.

The workshops are structured through ten stages, providing students with a fundamental understanding of Adobe Photoshop. After going through these stages, students will be able to independently use tools and apply acquired knowledge in various aspects of their education. Each workshop is designed in two segments. The first segment includes a detailed explanation of the tools in Adobe Photoshop and their application. In the second segment of the workshop, students, with my assistance, implement the acquired knowledge through practical work and tasks, Lejla states, thus explaining the steps of the workshop in more detail.

> We can see how much support and positive feedback mean to us, even from Lejla's example. After just the first workshop held, one of the students thanked Lejla for her selfless dedication and all the useful things she taught them. The message was full of praise, and Lejla also shared with us the impressions of student Arnela Mujić, which she took away from her workshops:

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A workshop with Lejla is a beautiful experience. Through an inspiring presentation, she allowed me and all attendees to learn so much, and her way of presenting was outstanding. With her approach and immense love for what she does, she encouraged me to delve deeper into the area she presented and continue my journey with new inspiration she inspired me with, says Arnela.

Lejla summed up her rich volunteer story to end our interview with a single message:

I would encourage all current and future Foundation Hastor scholars to appreciate all the opportunities the Foundation provides them. I encourage you to seize every opportunity offered, participate in every activity with the aim of learning and developing your own skills because it will undoubtedly be invaluable to us in the future.
