A conversation with Džulisa Otuzbir, an alumni who edited the majority of issues of the Newsletter

It has long been known that scholarship recipients of Foundation Hastor are recognised as members of society who, through their professional work, show how important it is for a community to have creative, educated and hardworking young people who will improve it every day. In this anniversary issue of the Newsletter, we bring you the story of Džulisa Otuzbir, a former scholarship recipient and member of the editorial

team of the Hastor Foundation, who edited the majority of the editions of the Newsletter, and her journey from a scholarship recipient of the Hastor Foundation to a young European ambassador for the Western Balkans.

1. How did being part of a big family like the Hastor Foundation feel?

I can proudly say that I am one of the first scholarship recipients of the Hastor Foundation. Following its work and participating in the development of the Foundation, I wasn't aware of its size, however, when I look back on its journey, I am proud that I was part of such a community that gathers a large number of scholarship recipients, so I often emphasise how the Foundation didn't grow, but how we grew.



I was a scholarship recipient of the Hastor Foundation for 12 years, from 2007 to 2019. In the beginning, I volunteered as a mentor with the students, and soon I gradually started writing for the newsletter, after which I officially became a member of the editorial team. In addition to volunteering and participating in mandatory activities, I gladly participated in all other events organized by the Foundation.

3. What was it like to be a member of the editorial team and then the editor of the newsletter?

As a child, I always enjoyed writing and creative expression. I loved answering letters to scholarship recipients and my great passion for writing was already discovered then. In the beginning, it was difficult to adapt my literary and artistic writing style to the journalistic style because I was not used to such a form of written expression. Nadira Berbić, a scholarship recipient at the time, directed me towards journalistic objective, concise, and unbiased writing, and over time I perfected that type of writing skill as well. Writing for the newsletter was, above all, a great joy for me. I did not expect to become an editor. At the very beginning, there was not even an official team of people editing the newsletter. I volunteered and wrote on my own for a certain period, and only later did we start gathering a real team, which included copywriters, a proofreader, and a graphic designer. For the first time, I encountered responsibility and learned how to lead a team. Later it truly benefited me in many areas of my life.

4. What were your responsibilities, and how did you cope with such a responsible position?

This is what I loved immensely and what fulfilled me. It was not difficult for me at all, nor was it an obligation. Even when I was in Portugal on a student exchange, I wrote texts for the newsletter.



Everything I wrote was truly from the heart. When it comes to responsibilities, at the beginning it was very difficult for me to acquire the skill of delegating responsibilities because, as I have already pointed out, at the very beginning I did everything myself. Later, I managed to organize a team consisting of three authors, a proofreader, and a graphic designer.

5. How did you balance your responsibilites as a student with your responsibilites at the Foundation?

It wasn't difficult for me at all; we had enough time to distribute the responsibilities evenly. Certainly, we encountered many challenges, but we managed to overcome them with good organization.



6. What is the essence of volunteering for you? Didyou continue volunteering after the volunteer engagement within the Hastor Foundation?

Although we are not currently in the Foundation, we always remain volunteers. I think that I will forever consider myself a volunteer of the Hastor Foundation. Although I am not doing anything as a volunteer for the Foundation, I always try to respond to invitations and various activities within the Alumni Club.

Shortly after my official volunteer engagement at the Foundation, I became part of the Young European Ambassadors Network, which also promotes volonteering. We had a lot of different activities. We do not just specialize in discussing EU integrations and shooting pictures for the media. It must be stated that we are people who, prior to becoming ambassadors, were volunteers and acknowledged as socially conscious and valuable individuals. I think that every young person should experience volunteer work and feel the satisfaction of the changes they have achieved. Volunteering

provides practical experience that we do not have in formal education, and therefore it is inevitable to become active in this area as well due to later in the labour market.

7. Was the volunteering experience you gained important to your studies, and in later business engagements, as well as your personal development?

In terms of studies, volunteering taught me how to be responsible, and it especially helped me in terms of my career. Today, I work as a communications specialist at UNDP, and I truly don't think I would have gotten to that position if I hadn't gained such significant experience at the Hastor Foundation and at the Network of Young European Ambassadors. Everything I've ever done as a volunteer has paid off after a certain amount of time.

8. What is it like to be a useful, excellent, and successful young individual in contemporary Bosnian society?


A person learns and improves while he is alive. I try to give back to the community all that I have acquired and learned. I try to transfer knowledge to young people. I think we should never stop and be satisfied with the thought that we have achieved everything in life. The pursuit of lifelong learning should be a goal for all of us.

9. What has the support of the Hastor Foundation meant in your life, and what is your message and advice to our scholarship recipients?

The Foundation's mission and desire for young people to stay here, contribute to the state and society and create positive changes inspired me. I tell our scholarship recipients to use all the potential and opportunities that the Hastor Foundation offers, so that they can excel and become valuable members of society. Let the young people understand volunteer engagement as a practice as well as an opportunity for personal improvement and progress, and an experience that will open many doors to success. When one day they become successful in their desired domains, let them not forget where they came from and where the roots of their success are.

The editorial team, translators and graphic designers from the very beginning to the present

The Hastor Foundation has always been a place of volunteerism, growth, self-improvement, and a witness to the success of young people. All of our alumni and current scholarship recipients have always had the opportunity to accustom their volunteer hours to themselves and to give their best in what they do best. They have truly showcased their best, as have all of our dedicated scholarship recipients who have spent years building our newsletter, which celebrates its 100th edition this month. Through all the editions of our newsletters, scholarship recipients have had the opportunity to develop as authors and translators while conducting various interviews and writing the most beautiful stories from the Hastor Foundation, as well as in the roles of the graphic team, where they have let their imagination run wild and beautified pages in the most complete way, expressing their creativity.

The editorial team of volunteers from the Hastor Foundation began writing the first editions of the newsletter as early as 2009. Those early editions differed greatly from today's bulletin, those were the very beginnings when we only shared our newsletter with our scholarship recipients. Back then, student recipients had to be creative in many ways, coming up with new ideas, creating new sections, and making the path easier for each subsequent generation that followed. Nevertheless, they had the will, desire, and mission, and, alongside all of that, their dedicated work and effort became the crowning achievement of it all. Below, we bring you stories and experiences from our alumni, who were some of the first members of the editorial team of the Hastor Foundation.

The first editor of our bulletin was **Enver Fejzović**, and here he shares his experience of writing the bulletin

in its early days:





I've been the editor of the Hastor Foundation bulletin for almost two years (23 issues). None of this would have been possible without the rest of the valuable team that made up the editorial staff. Now, looking back on that period, I can say it's one of the fondest memories I'll cherish for the rest of my life. The cheerful and hardworking editorial team, ready at any time of day or night to fulfill the tasks set before them, is something special that is rare nowadays. I'm glad to see the 100th issue of the Hastor Foundation bulletin being released as evidence that there's a diligent team of people who have continued where we left off, and I look forward to every upcoming milestone.



Emina Sijahović was an active member of the editorial team for a full three years. However, even after that period, she occasionally sent some of her texts and articles that were published in the bulletin. The bulletins in their previous version differed greatly from those we began sharing with the public in 2015.

The year when the first bulletins were written was a time of internet and social media development, although not to the extent that we know today, so those bulletins were printed and sent to elementary and high school students through their mentors. This way, awareness of the

bulletin was spread, and people of all ages had the opportunity to read and enjoy its content. The number of team members was significantly smaller than it is today, and the content became richer, more emotional, and more developed from month to month and from year to year.



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It was very interesting for me to work with that team because we worked synergistically and I felt we were doing something important. Afall ourvery hard work, we got a result, which we admired for a whole month until the next newsletter, and we proudly shared it with fa, and friends, colleagues. I loved writing about our trips and monthly meetings the most. The stories were always somehow full of emotions, says our Emina Sijahović.

Besides Emina, other scholarship recipients who wrote for the newsletter, edited it, and translated texts also shared their experiences with us, telling us their stories of how they progressed through volunteering at the Hastor Foundation over the years.

Members of the editorial, translation, and graphic design teams shared their experiences with us and how they expressed their deepest emotions on paper with the editorial team over the years.

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I spent most of my volunteer engagement on the editorial team. Everything I built over the years at the Hastor Foundation, I built for my world of verses. Everything else can be someone else's, but my writing is only mine. That's why the Hastor Foundation is a part of the world that will be a part of me no matter what job I do, says our Nedžma Latić.





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My engagement in the editorial team connected me with different scholarship recipients and their stories. Besides my team, which then consisted of creative and hardworking girls, now successful women according to their visions of success, there were also scholarship recipients we wrote about and shared inspirational stories about. These stories gave me ideas about where I could contribute, says Sadžida Kosovac.

However, we had members who had been involved in various teams for years. Una Karabeg and Emina Adilović, Vedin Klovo and Almedina Numić, besides being part of the editorial team, were also in the translation team that elevated our bulletin to a higher level.

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At the Hastor Foundation, I had the privilege to contribute in various ways, from the editorial team, social media, project team, to mentoring, and ultimately, as the head of the English translation team.
