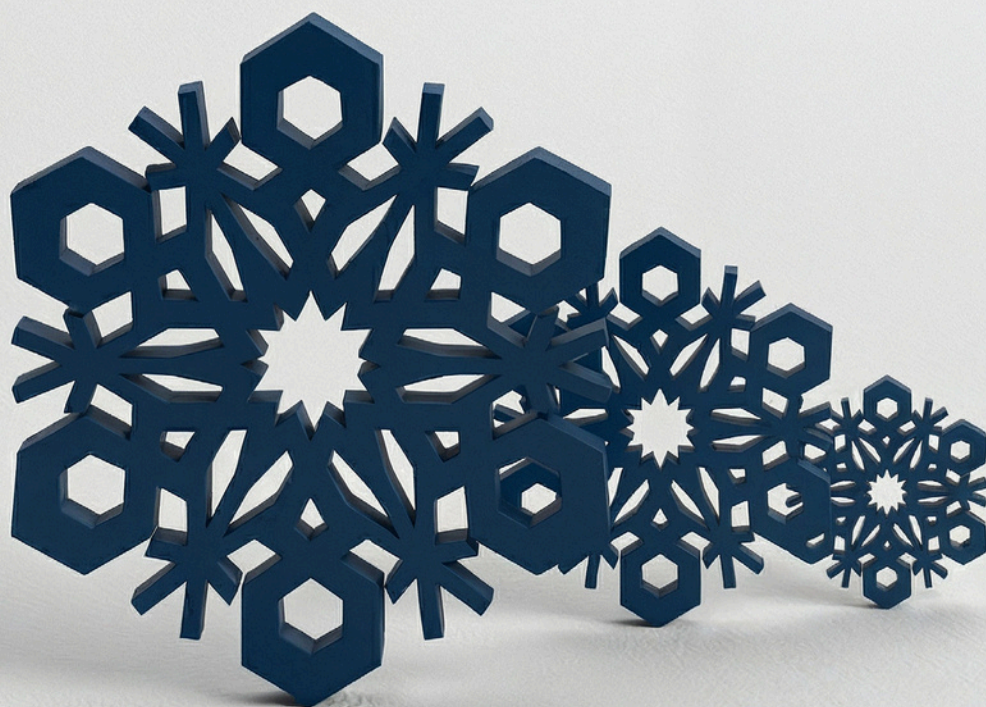

Scholarship Agreements Signed with New Student Scholars for the Academic Year 2025/2026

In line with its long-term mission, at the end of this month, the Hastor Foundation organised the signing of scholarship agreements with new student scholars selected through the Scholarship Call for the academic year 2025/2026.

This event officially marked the beginning of a new scholarship cycle, through which the Hastor Foundation continues to provide continuous financial support to students across Bosnia and Herzegovina. The scholarship program is designed as comprehensive support for young people during their academic journey, with the aim of making studying easier, strengthening personal capacities, and creating opportunities for professional development.

The signing of the agreements is an important moment for both the Foundation and the new scholars, as it marks the beginning of a shared journey based on trust, responsibility, and common values. Through clearly defined rights and obligations, the scholarship program encourages academic commitment, personal growth, and active participation of young people in society.

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Cooperation Between the Municipality of Novi Grad Sarajevo and the Hastor Foundation – Successful Implementation of the Project “Volunteering as a Mechanism for Youth Empowerment”

The project “Volunteering as a Mechanism for Youth Empowerment” was implemented in cooperation between the Municipality of Novi Grad Sarajevo and the Hastor Foundation, which has once again, through joint efforts, provided financial and mentoring support to primary and high school students, as well as university students from the area of the Municipality of Novi Grad Sarajevo.

The Municipality of Novi Grad Sarajevo co-financed the project with 3,000.00 BAM, and the funds were used for the payment of regular monthly scholarships to scholars in the period from September to December. This project gave young people from the Municipality of Novi Grad Sarajevo the opportunity to actively participate in volunteer and educational activities, while at the same time receiving financial and mentoring support, especially students from socially vulnerable backgrounds. Through this project, the connection between young people and the local community was further strengthened, as well as the importance of volunteering as one of the key mechanisms of youth social engagement.

During the project implementation, students participated in educational and mentoring workshops covering various topics related to the importance of volunteering, social activism, and the development of personal, professional, and entrepreneurial skills.

This project confirmed the importance of partnerships between institutions and organizations in creating positive change, empowering young people, and developing volunteering in the local community. We sincerely thank the Municipality of Novi Grad Sarajevo for its support in the implementation of the project “Volunteering as a Mechanism for Youth Empowerment.”

1. How would you, from your perspective, describe the year 2025 at the Hastor Foundation?

From my perspective, the year 2025 at the Hastor Foundation was extremely dynamic. As a long-time scholarship recipient, I had the opportunity through various roles, first as a volunteer, then as part of the administration, and today as an employee, to get to know the Foundation better. Working for the benefit of young people is something that truly makes me happy and gives me additional motivation and wind at my back. As every year, the Foundation accepted a large number of new scholarship recipients, and I had the opportunity to participate in almost all phases of the process, from organisation and communication to direct work with young people. These experiences enabled me to better understand the needs of scholarship recipients, but also to actively contribute to strengthening the network of young people across Bosnia and Herzegovina. I remember the year 2025 as a year of growth, both personal and professional, but also as confirmation that through joint work we can build a strong, connected, and supportive community of young people.

2. What were the key projects of the Hastor Foundation in 2025 and which results would you especially highlight?

During 2025, the Hastor Foundation implemented a series of significant projects, and I would especially highlight collaborations with municipalities, not only in the area of Sarajevo but also across Bosnia and Herzegovina. Exceptionally high-quality cooperation with municipalities represents a strong example of joint action aimed at strengthening the prosperity of young people and creating better opportunities for their education and development. This year as well, after the successful completion of the pilot phase of the mentoring program First Step into the Business World, we continued this excellent project that introduces our diligent students into a professional environment and provides invaluable experience. One of the projects I am particularly proud of, and in whose planning and organisation I participated, is the new project “Together for Knowledge and Education”.

Through this project, the Foundation goes a step further and provides free tutoring and educational workshops to all pupils, including those who are not scholarship recipients of the Hastor Foundation. In this way, we enable pupils outside our network to receive the same type of support, knowledge, and opportunities. We are especially proud of this project because, through it, we help strengthen communities and build young people with the idea that every child deserves equal education opportunities. We are aware of the fact that additional tutoring today is often financially inaccessible to a large number of parents, and precisely for that reason, we want to provide maximum support to pupils and their families. We look forward to continuing existing, as well as new collaborations and projects that await us in 2026, with the aim of continuing to strengthen the education system and support for young people across Bosnia and Herzegovina.

3. Which competencies or values, in your opinion, do scholarship recipients develop the most through the Foundation's activities?

In my opinion, scholarship recipients of the Hastor Foundation develop a whole range of important competencies and values through various activities. First of all, there is a significant strengthening of self-confidence, communication, and interpersonal skills. Through various forms of volunteering, scholarship recipients gain practical experience and knowledge, especially in working with children and young people, which later represents a great advantage on the labour market. Volunteering in the Foundation's administration is very dynamic and requires a high level of resourcefulness, responsibility, and organisation, especially through daily communication, work with documentation, and solving various challenges. Every learned skill and every experience they gain has long-term value.

I would also like to share personal experience, because I myself previously had a fear of public speaking and speaking in front of people, but already as a scholarship recipient, through various Foundation activities, I learned how to turn that fear into motivation.

4. Have you noticed an increase in interest in certain topics or skills among scholarship recipients?

Of course, recently we have clearly recorded an increase in scholarship recipients' interest in certain topics and skills that follow contemporary societal needs. Particularly prominent is interest in topics related to internet safety, strengthening self-confidence, personal development, and motivation, as well as in areas related to the IT sector. When it comes to skills, we notice that pupils are increasingly developing digital competencies, such as computer work, graphic design, programming, and other IT skills. We are glad that our scholarship recipients come from different faculties and show exceptional ability to adapt and work on multiple tasks simultaneously. This increase in interest shows that scholarship recipients are aware of the importance of continuous learning and skill development that will help them be competitive on the labour market, but also responsible, self-confident, and informed young people ready to respond to the challenges of the future.

7. What does working at the Hastor Foundation mean to you?

Working at the Hastor Foundation means every day, again and again, being a significant link in the realisation of the dreams of thousands of young people. We provide financial support, but what is equally important is the friendly support that we nurture from the very first day of the Foundation's existence. My colleagues and I witness various life stories, both difficult and emotional, as well as beautiful and joyful ones. All of this represents personal growth for us, because we strive to be a light in the lives of those upon whom the future of Bosnia and Herzegovina rests.



With the instructional classes of the Hastor Foundation, mathematics and physics become easy-to-master subjects

Mathematics and physics are among the most demanding subjects in schools. Many pupils struggle with difficult material, and private tutoring represents a financial burden for families. The Hastor Foundation recognised this problem and offered a solution through Instructional Teaching Clubs. Within the volunteer program, student scholarship recipients provide free assistance to pupil scholarship recipients.

The Mathematics and Physics Club brings together students who help primary and high school pupils master the material. This support goes beyond merely explaining formulas and tasks. Students build trust with pupils and motivate them to believe in their own abilities. The results are visible and measurable.

Pupils improve their grades and successfully pass exams. Parents no longer have to set aside money for private lessons.

Student Emina Bistrić has been volunteering in the Mathematics and Physics Club for the second year. Her meetings with pupils include a short theoretical introduction and solving tasks. She adapts the flow of each meeting to the needs of each pupil. In addition to transferring knowledge, Emina invests special effort in providing motivation and support.

I consider the most successful meetings to be those in which I notice active participation of pupils. It is precisely this interaction that motivates me, and my favourite feeling is when they or their parents inform me of some success they achieved thanks to my tutoring. I think that if I help at least one child and become their inspiration, my goal is reached and the mission fulfilled, emphasizes Emina.
